Bestselling author who shares her love of Britain in her two mystery series, the *Potting Shed* books, which feature Pru Parke, a middle-aged American gardener transplanted from Texas to England, and *Birds of a Feather* books, which follow Julia Lanchester, bird lover, who runs a tourist office in a Suffolk village. Marty leads garden tours to England, Scotland

and Ireland, spending free moments deep in research for her books. Or in pubs.



Candace Robb

Internationally bestselling author of the Owen Archer mysteries, Candace Robb returns to medieval York with a new sleuth, Kate Clifford, in *The Service of the Dead*. *Midwest Book Review* describes it as “a strikingly well crafted novel that is a compelling page-turner from beginning to end.” As Emma Champion, she has also published two historical novels about the women of Edward III’s court.

The Lake Forest Park author will discuss her popular debut mystery. In *Under an English Heaven*, marriage proves a dangerous proposition for American Ellie Kent, who accompanies her new husband to his English village and finds herself suspected of murder. As evidence mounts against
